

A correction of EWD 1112

The final observation of EWD 1112 for fresh variables x', y' from a nontrivial type (i.e. with at least 2 distinct values, so that $[x'=y']_{x'y'} = \text{false}$) should have been as follows:

$$\begin{aligned}
 & [R \wedge \neg R \Rightarrow J]_{xx'yy'} \\
 = & \{\text{def. of } J \text{ in extended context}\} \\
 & [R \wedge \neg R \Rightarrow x=y \wedge x'=y']_{xx'yy'} \\
 = & \{x'y' \text{ fresh}\} \\
 & [R \wedge \neg R \Rightarrow [x=y \wedge x'=y']_{x'y'}]_{xy} \\
 = & \{\text{type of } x'y' \text{ nonempty}\} \\
 & [R \wedge \neg R \Rightarrow x=y \wedge [x'=y']_{x'y'}]_{xy} \\
 = & \{\text{type of } x'y' \text{ nontrivial}\} \\
 & [R \wedge \neg R \Rightarrow \text{false}]
 \end{aligned}$$

and as a constraint on R the last line is more stringent than $[R \wedge \neg R \Rightarrow J]$, i.e. Cartesian extension destroys antisymmetry and turns partial orders into preorders.

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
